From the 2001-2002 President

WAMSO–Minnesota Orchestra Volunteer Association at 53 years is a dynamic group of women and men whose mission is to support the Minnesota Orchestra and promote music education.

I am pleased to report that our volunteer association is a national model. WAMSO's 2000 American Craft Council Preview Reception won the 2001 American Symphony Orchestra League (ASOL) award for outstanding fundraising. The 2001 WAMSO Spring Fashion Show was likewise honored by the ASOL in 2002. We are proud of the national recognition our extraordinary programs have received.

How exactly do volunteers support the Minnesota Orchestra?

First, we are season ticket subscribers. In 2002, one hundred percent of our volunteer board of directors supported the Minnesota Orchestra through concert subscriptions. In addition, over fifty percent of our general membership purchased Orchestra subscriptions. We encourage community support of the Orchestra through ticket sales.

Second, we are passionate about music education. We believe that music education enhances life and builds audiences. Together, WAMSO and the MOA education department introduced over 100,000 children to live classical music this year. That is a remarkable achievement. Our new music director designate, Osmo Vänskä, is looking forward to working with all of us to expand and further improve our education programs.

Third, our talented and energetic volunteers provide services that support the orchestra directly, such as ushering and greeting at concerts. We lobby legislators when arts funding is threatened, and we support the paid staff. Our members consider themselves a part of the Orchestra family.

Fourth, WAMSO is a training ground for outstanding Orchestra leadership. Many remarkable WAMSO members have served on the Orchestra board.

Finally, we contribute and raise important funds for our Orchestra. WAMSO originated the Symphony Ball and, over 45 years, developed it into the premier gala in the Twin Cities. With the transfer in 2001 of our largest fundraiser to the MOA development staff, WAMSO is refocusing its energies. This year, we completed a strategic plan to target our considerable talents and community presence in ways that are most helpful to the Orchestra. You will hear more about these plans in the months ahead.

During our first 50 years, WAMSO donated over 10 million dollars to the Minnesota Orchestra. WAMSO endowed the Principal Percussion Chair in 1985. This year, WAMSO members contributed over \$300,000 to the annual Guaranty Fund.

In summary, our volunteer association is vital, healthy and passionate about music. We subscribe, we serve, we educate, we train leadership and we support the Minnesota Orchestra by contributing money.

According to the Symphony Orchestra Institute in Chicago, publisher of *Harmony Magazine*, a healthy orchestra family requires four equal partners: the musicians; the board of directors; the staff; and the volunteers. WAMSO is proud to be a part of this orchestra family. We look forward to supporting our Orchestra creatively and energetically through its centennial and into the next century.

Accomplishments in Education

Award-winning WAMSO education programs reach over 47,000 children each year, inspiring young music lovers and aspiring musicians for a lifetime. More than one million children have participated in our programs over the last fifty years.

Adventures in Music Previews: Held prior to the Minnesota Orchestra's Adventures in Music for Families concerts, these one-hour workshops introduce children ages four to twelve to musical concepts and enhance their enjoyment of the concert. Eight previews on four Sunday afternoons last year attracted over 400 children and their families.

Kinder Konzerts: Last year, 5,900 four- and five-year-old preschoolers were introduced to Orchestra Hall and their first experience with live classical music. Volunteers logged more than 3,000 hours in the management of this award-winning program. On twelve dates and at forty-eight concerts throughout the school year, trained volunteers guided children from 170 schools through a hands-on "sound factory", and then onstage for a concert specifically composed for Kinder Konzerts and performed by an ensemble of Minnesota Orchestra musicians.

In 2001-2002 Kinder Konzerts presented a musical retelling of *Jack and the Beanstalk*, with music composed by Janika Vandervelde. The 25th anniversary of Kinder Konzerts will be celebrated in 2002-2003. WAMSO has commissioned composer Steve Heitzeg to create music for Helen Ward's delightful children's book *The Tin Forest*.

Education Outreach: Kinder Konzerts were replicated during the summer for the Minneapolis Aquatennial, Marshall Field's Day of Music, and prior to the Symphony for the Cities concert at Plymouth's Hilde Performing Arts Center. Volunteers helped children and adults experiment with instruments – violins, drums and xylophones – at the Minnesota State Fair and the Frank Lloyd Wright Bridge opening celebration.

Gear Your Ear ® Curriculum: In 2002, WAMSO initiated a new partnership with 89.3 WCAL to promote this curriculum-based study of masterworks of the orchestral repertoire. This program augments or, in some cases, totally supplies music appreciation programs in three hundred schools statewide, reaching over 40,000 fifth and sixth graders. Eighteen teams competed in the annual listening contest at Orchestra Hall on May 3, and all competitors attended an open rehearsal of the Minnesota Orchestra.

Listening Houses: Special guest speakers joined WAMSO members for dinner and conversation at five Listening Houses throughout the year. These programs enhanced the enjoyment of the Orchestra's season through increased interaction among musicians, MOA staff, music experts and WAMSO members. A holiday brunch was held in December. Committee members also sold guest artists' tapes and CDs at Orchestra Hall, raising \$7,300.

Meet the Masters: Aspiring young musicians experienced a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to work with and learn from world-renowned artists. Pianist Garrick Ohlsson, baritone Nathan Gunn, and violinist Nadja Salerno-Sonnenberg each presented instruction to selected students and inspired audiences at Orchestra Hall and the University of Minnesota School of Music.

Young Artist Competition: DaXun Zhang, a twenty year old double bass player from the University of Indiana, was awarded both the first prize and the grand prize at the Young Artist Competition finals on January 13, 2002. Only four other grand prizes have been awarded in the 46-year history of the competition. As grand prize winner, Zhang will perform with the Minnesota Orchestra at a future subscription concert.

Created in 1956 – and WAMSO's oldest education program – the contest is designed to discover and encourage exceptional young talent through a regional competition. Prizes include performance opportunities, summer scholarships, and cash awards totaling approximately \$20,000.

Musicians under the age of 26 from eleven states and two Canadian provinces were eligible to compete. Two hundred nineteen application packets were mailed resulting in fifty-two taped performances judged in the preliminary round.

Six talented young musicians competed in the final round at Orchestra Hall.

Service to the Orchestra

During the last year, WAMSO members documented over 10,000 hours of service to the Minnesota Orchestra and to WAMSO programs. Here are some of the ways WAMSO supported the Orchestra during the 2001-2002 season:

- Encouraged WAMSO members to purchase subscription packages for the 2001-2002 concert season by calling all WAMSO members
- Provided volunteer ushers for 16 coffee concerts
- ◆ Provided volunteers for the Minnesota Orchestra Riverfront Concert at Harriet Island in September 2001
- ◆ Assisted the MOA marketing department in a "thank-a-thon" to all first-time subscribers
- ◆ Decorated the freight elevator, which was used by violinist Itzhak Perlmann during his visit to Orchestra Hall in April
- ◆ Supplied volunteers for the 2002 Symphony Ball in June
- Supplied and helped coordinate over 100 volunteers for the Marshall Field's Day of Music in July
- ◆ Staffed the WAMSO dessert booth during all MusicFest concerts in July and August
- ◆ Hosted a Musical Petting Zoo at the State Fair as part of Minnesota Orchestra Day at the State Fair

The dollar value of volunteer time has been calculated by the Independent Sector (a coalition of leading non-profits, foundations, and corporations) as \$16.05 per hour for 2001. The in-kind contribution of WAMSO volunteers for 2001-2002 was 10,200 hours multiplied by \$16.05 or \$163,710. WAMSO is very proud of the actual and in-kind contributions we have made to the Orchestra.

Fundraising Accomplishments

WAMSO hosted two major fundraising events in 2001-2002: the annual WAMSO Spring Fashion Show and the American Craft Council Preview Party. Close to \$50,000 was raised to support WAMSO music education programs.
